# Monroe man given 10 years for forgery

A Monroe man was sentenced to serve seven concurrent 10-year probated terms on several burglary and forgery counts in Walton County Superior Court Dec. 4.

Charles Blade, Campton Gardens, Monroe, was given five concurrent 10-year probated sentences when he pleaded to five counts of forgery, first degree. Blade was also ordered to pay a total of \$325 in restitution.

Blade was also sentenced to two concurrent 10-year probated terms after he pleaded guilty to two counts of burglary. In those counts, he was ordered to pay a total of \$998.55 in restitution and a \$1,000 fine.

The sentences were handed down by Walton County Superior Court Judge Thomas Ridgeway.

In other sentences issued Dec. 4, Mrs. Patricia Westfield, Box 654, Loganville, was ordered to serve five years in confinement when she entered a guilty plea to a count of hindering the apprehension and punishment of a criminal.

Majorie Annette Wheeler, address listed as Highway 138, was given a 10-year probated sentence and fined \$1,000 after she entered a guilty plea to a count of burglary. Ms. Wheeler had been charged in

connection with a August burglary at Social Circle Drug Company, 129 S. Cherokee Road, Social Circle.

Ms. Wheeler was also ordered to pay \$2,549.86 restitution in that incident.

A Walnut Grove man was sentenced to 10 years probation after he pleaded guilty to a count of aggravated assault.

Lawson Phelps, Rt. 3, Loganville, was given that sentence after he pleaded guilty to charges stemming from a May 3 incident. Phelps was also given, in two other counts, two five-year probated sentences, one to be served consecutively to the 10-year term, and one to be served concurrently.

In an additional aggravated assault charge to which Phelps entered a guilty plea, he was given a five-year probated sentence.

A Monroe man was ordered to serve five concurrent 10-year terms in confinement after he pleaded guilty to five counts of forgery, first degree.

In addition, Phillip Bell, 510 Harris St., was ordered to six concurrent 12-month terms in confinement when entered a guilty plea for six counts of writing a bad check.

Bell was also given two consecutive 10-year probated sentences for two additional charges of forgery, first

degree. Bell's sentences were handed down by Judge Ridgeway Nov. 19.

Tony Henderson, Covington, was ordered to serve five years in confinement when he pleaded Nolo Contendere to a count of theft by receiving stolen goods.

Michael Jackson, Lot 68, Rolling Hills Trailer Park, Monroe, was ordered to serve two years of a 10-year sentence in confinement after he entered a guilty plea to a count of burglary.

George Steven Venable, Lot

Truell's Trailer Park, Brown's Bridge Road, Covington, was ordered to serve five years of a 15-year sentence in confinement when he pleaded guilty to a count of burglary.

An Athens woman was given several sentences when she entered guilty pleas to several counts of theft by receiving stolen property and theft by shoplifting.

Emotrice Taylor, 150 Head St., was given two concurrent 10-year terms, two years of each to be served in confinement, after she pleaded guilty

to two counts of theft by shoplifting. Ms. Taylor was also ordered to serve two concurrent 10-year probated sentences when she pleaded guilty to theft by receiving stolen property.

She was also ordered to serve six concurrent 12-month probated sentences, three stemming from guilty pleas entered in theft by receiving stolen property counts, and three stemming from guilty pleas entered in theft by shoplifting counts.

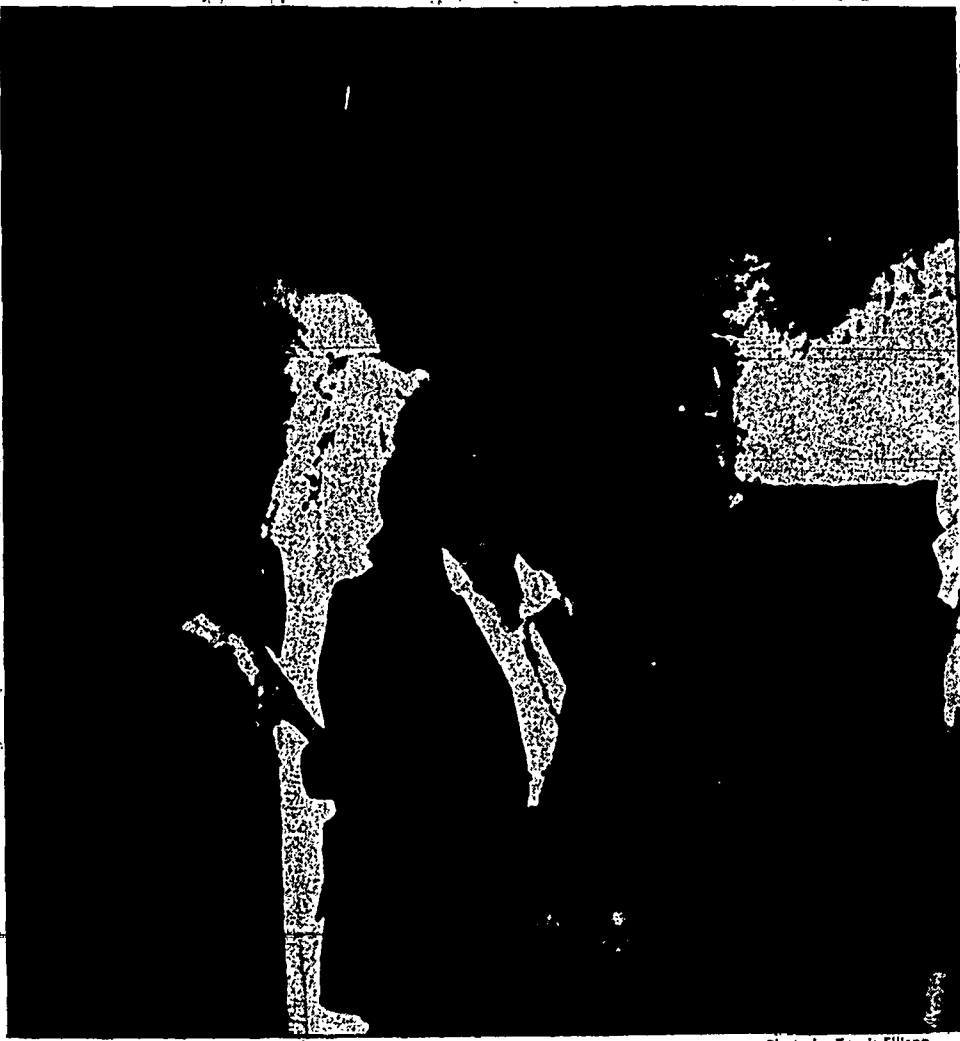
